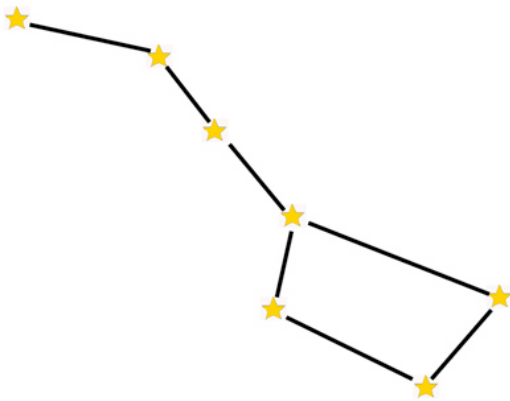


Gazing at the Night Sky

Drawing an imaginary line between stars and planets one can see distinct shapes. The big dipper is one of the well-known shapes we can see on a clear night.

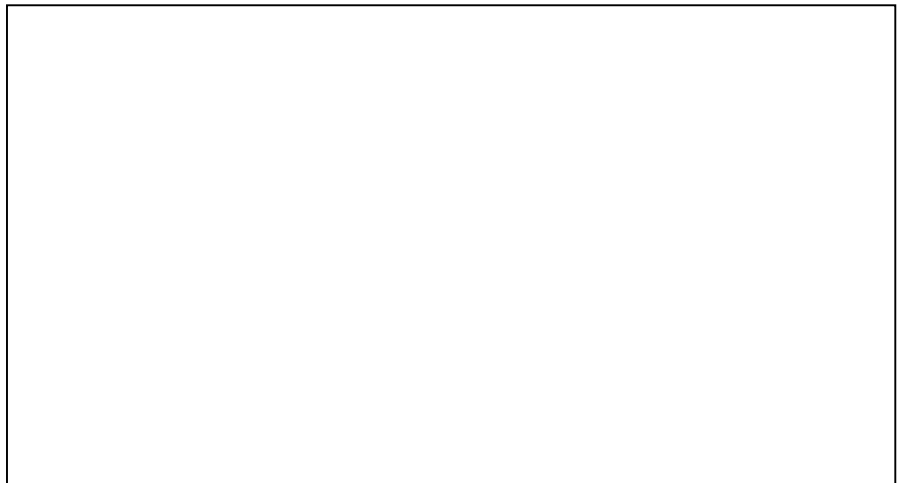
